CLASSES UPDATE:

PRESIDENT:

FRANK MOLONEY

U3A Geelong has expanded with the closure of U3A Corio Bay. This expansion warrants careful planning and reviewing of what is already offered plus introducing one-off lectures, forums and discussions groups on topics of community interest. I would envisage partnering with local organisations such as the Geelong Regional Library, Deakin University, City of

Greater Geelong, Wadawurrung Cooperative and other community organisations to grow Geelong as a progressive and enquiring community.

One area that we may pursue could be the Federal Government referendum this year on an Indigenous Voice to Parliament. I believe that U3A Geelong could play a significant role in providing information and discussion with experts to support or understanding of both our Australian Constitution and what this referendum means, thus an educational role for all our members. This is just one example of the possibilities that U3A leadership can provide.
